



## Year 2 Spring Term 2 - 'The Farm Shop' English Learning



Here are some suggested activities to do with your child at home that are linked to our current topic. Thank you for your continued support!

### Reading

Please continue to read daily with your child; exploring a variety of texts and hold discussion about what is being read. Encourage your child to make predictions and give their opinions about what they read. You could also write book reviews or recount a book you have read from the point of view of another character.

### Non-Chronological Report

Can you create a report, leaflet, booklet or poster about an animal of your choice? Try to include; an introduction, a description of the animal's appearance, what they eat, their habitat and interesting facts. You could also include pictures and decorate your report.



### SATs Practice

The children normally do the KS1 reading and Grammar tests. It would still be useful for the children to familiarise themselves with the types of questions on the test in preparation for KS2.

If you do not have facilities to print the papers, the children could write their answers on a separate piece of paper.



### Spellings

Children could continue to look at and practice the Year 2 common exception words, the days of the week, months of the year and number words. To reinforce these spellings, children could also practice writing them in sentences. A copy of these has been included in your child's pack.



### Riddles

Remembering the riddle rules, can you create a selection of riddles? You could write riddles about household items, food, animals, book characters or your family. Can you illustrate each of your riddles?



### Handwriting

The children could continue to practice their cursive handwriting. Children need to ensure their handwriting is a uniform size, sits on the line and letters are formed correctly. There are handwriting sheets available at [www.twinkl.co.uk](http://www.twinkl.co.uk) to download for free.
