



Year 2 Spring Term 2 - 'The Farm Shop' Maths Learning



Here are some suggested activities to do with your child at home that are linked to our current learning. Thank you for your continued support!

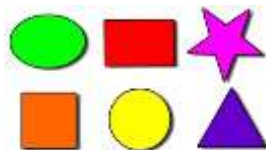
Time

Practice telling the time to o'clock, quarter past, half past and quarter to. You could also practice counting around the clock in 5 minute intervals, talking about the amount of time in an hour or a day and discussing the time it takes to do different activities.



Shape

Talk about the shapes children see around the home in day to day life. What 2D and 3D shapes can they see? Talk about the properties of the shapes and their similarities and differences, including the number of sides, vertices (corners) and faces.



SATs Practice

The children normally do the KS1 Arithmetic and Reasoning tests. It would still be useful for the children to familiarise themselves with the types of questions on the test in preparation for KS2.



Multiplication

In Year 2, children are expected to know their 2, 5 and 10 times tables. 3 times tables may also be learnt. You could practice counting in these intervals, play times tables games and solve multiplication problems (Ben has 5 packs of apples, each pack contains 10 apples. How many apples does he have altogether?).



Money

Practice recognition of different coins and notes. Can your child make different amounts with the coins? Can they represent the same amount in different ways ($10p + 10p = 20p$, $10p + 5p + 5p = 20p$)? You could set up a pretend shop at home for your child to practice using money.



Games

There are lots of maths games available online at www.topmarks.co.uk and www.mathsframe.co.uk. 'Hit the Button' on Topmarks is one that we often use in school. You could also play board games together as these often involve counting skills.
