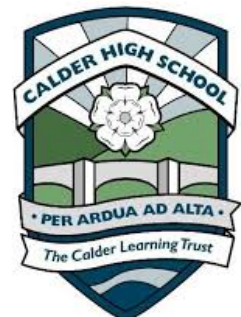
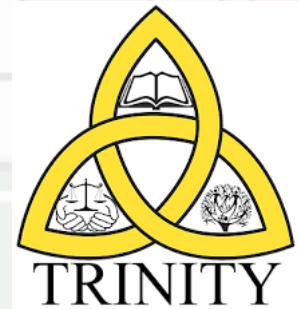

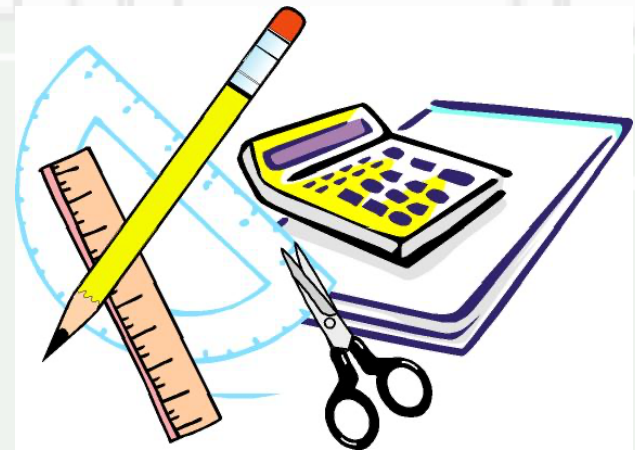
Transition To Secondary School

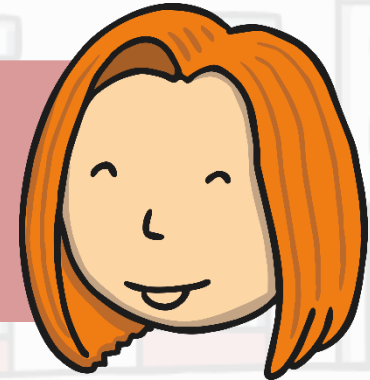
