



## Home Learning Summary EYFS

The following information is intended to inform our pupils and parents/carers about our school expectations and provision regarding remote learning. It has been put in place so that all children can continue with their education during periods of self isolation or local / national lockdowns.

Our school plan for remote learning has been carefully devised and meets the expectations set out in the DFE guidance 'Remote Education Support'.

If a child does not have access to a computer/laptop/electronic device and /or the internet, school will do all we can to support our children and families. Remote devices and 4G connections will be offered and assistance will be provided for our most vulnerable children. Parents will be encouraged to make school aware of any barriers to accessing remote learning.

Our online Learning Platform in EYFS is via Purple Mash. This is primarily a way to communicate with children and parents. Every child has their own Purple Mash account; the children were introduced to this platform for home and school in October 2020, and are now familiar with its format. Pupils are expected to log into their Purple Mash accounts each day to access their learning and are encouraged to spend a similar amount of time completing activities to the time they would spend learning in school. In EYFS we expect that remote education will take pupils broadly 2 - 3 hours per day. Activities for EYFS are communicated via Purple Mash. The children's learning is carefully tied in to how they would be learning in school where possible, so many tasks are practical, play based experiences to allow the children to develop their learning in a way that is appropriate for their developmental stages. This has been explained carefully to parents.
