

## **Home Learning Summary KS2**

The following information is intended to inform our pupils and parents/carers about our school expectations and provision regarding remote learning. It has been put in place so that all children can continue with their education during periods of self isolation or local / national lockdowns.

Our school plan for remote learing has been carefully devised and meets the expectations set out in the DFE guidance 'Remote Education Support'.

Information regarding Covid Remote Learning provision and support can be located on our school website on the home page in our Remote Education Provision section. Here you will also find information regarding our curriculum and expectations (Our Curriculum page).

If a child does not have access to a computer/laptop/electronic device and /or the internet, school will do all we can to support our children and families. Remote devices and 4G connections will be offered and assistance will be provided for our most vulnerable children. Parents will be encouraged to make school aware of any barriers to accessing remote learning.

Our on-line Learning Platform at KS2 is Purple Mash. Every child has their own Purple Mash account; the children have been using this platform both at home and in school since Spring 2020, and are therefore familiar with its format. Pupils are expected to log into their Purple Mash accounts each day to access their learning and are expected to spend a similar amount of time completing this as they would spend learning in school. In KS2 we expect that remote education will take pupils broadly 4 hours per day.

Below is a summary of what our pupils in KS2 can expect:

Daily activities (2Dos) will be set for your child to complete by their teacher: A Reading Task

A foundation Subject Task

Pupils will be required to access 'teaching content' by accessing online video teaching sessions from DFE recommended educational providers such as: Oak Academy, White Rose Maths and BBC Daily Bitesize. In addition to this your child's class teacher may set additional work and creative tasks.

Additional information relevant to your child's learning and Year group will be shared with your child through the Class Blog.

Additional Home Learning Support	School updates and information will continue to be sent via Newsletters and through emails.  Additional news and support can also be accessed through the school Twitter feed.  Regular emails will be sent by your child's class teacher through the class email account.  Additional information and local support/ provison will be signposted, for those wishing to complete extra activities.
Communication with children	Your child's class teacher will monitor their engagement with remote learning and will contact them / you if they have any concerns. SLT will monitor engagement and support staff with this.  Initial contact will be through the pupils 2email account on Purple Mash. Parents will then be contacted by email / telephone to offer support and advice if the teacher has not made contact with the child.  A daily class email will be posted to your child to outline the tasks to be completed. Additional individual emails will be sent in response to need.  Pupils are encouraged to upload their completed work and their class teacher will mark and send feedback, praising achievements and offering next steps in order to improve their work. If the class teacher does not feel that this is the pupils best work, then they will be asked to 'redo' and improve this work.
Communication with parents	Parents are able to continue to contact the school via telephone or by email.  Additionally class teachers can be contacted directly through their class email accounts.  Admin staff and teachers will respond as soon as possible.  Pupils identified as vulnerable will be contacted and offered support as necessary.  SEND children will be contacted and support and advice given.  Paper learning packs are provided for those who need them  IT equipment has been loaned to children who are struggling to access home learning  Class Teachers will continue to share news through the school Twitter feed.
