We completely understand that it is a big worry if your child has additional needs. Please trust us to give your child the best support we can. Support takes many forms and is happening constantly throughout school every day.

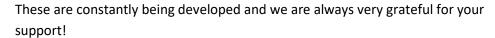


We will try our very best to accommodate your wishes as parent but we do have to work within national and local constraints-please be understanding of this.

We have developed a multi-layered system to ensure that all children's needs are met fully. Just as a reminder, the diagram below will help to give a full picture of this.



Sensory checks

If you have a worry about your child's learning, behaviour or well-being, it is always worth having his/her vision/ hearing checked. Any issues in these areas can impact children significantly.



Any children who may need screening for Irlen Syndrome need a vision check prior to this, too.



Neurodiversity

Neurodiversity is part of life and part of every classroom. Some children have a combination of some of these areas of need and we will support them accordingly in school. We teach the children that everybody's brain is different and that some children/people just need a little extra support in some areas. This is a healthy way to view any needs your child may have and remember that three are lots of children (and parents) in a similar position. We are always happy to help!
